## **RETHINKING IRMA STERN**

Irma Stern was a world-renowned 20th century Jewish South African artist. Her works were largely inspired by the landscapes, cultures, dress and people of various African countries. In the '70s, after her death, her home in Cecil Road was converted into a museum by the University of Cape Town.

To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the UCT Irma Stern Museum, the university partnered with the WCED and launched a project for all Grade 11 Visual Arts learners in 2022. This project, which continued this year, invited the pupils to re-think, re-interpret and re-imagine the works of Irma Stern through an artwork of their own. Each school submits photographs of their pupils' artworks, and around 50 artworks are chosen for display in the museum.

This year, four Westerfordians were chosen for the exhibition. Congratulations to **Jamie Chames, Lucy Paterson, Katherine Stead and Delilah Stoloff,** whose works will be displayed in the museum for several weeks starting on 16 September.

### **MUSIC**

Monday the 31st of July, Tuesday the 1st of August and Wednesday the 2nd of August were all very busy music-filled days for musicians at Westerford. From captivating solos to enchanting ensemble performances, the stage came alive and showcased the exceptional musical talent we have among our pupils. As the normal school day progressed the music pupils were flying in and out of the music centre as pupils performed their repertoire for admired professionals. Some of the esteemed adjudicators for the group and individual eisteddfods included: Gary Craig (guitar), Elina Kroumova Koytcheva (strings), Blaine Jacobs (vocal), Danielle Rossouw (clarinet and saxophone), Pamela Kierman (brass), Esthea Kruger (piano), Paul Tizzard (drum), and Liesl Stoltz (flutes and recorders).

The eisteddfod also included all the big ensembles taking part in the event. Our adjudicators for the ensembles section included the highly regarded Pamela Kierman, an accomplished musician and educator from Stellenbosch University, as well as Daniel Nambassi, a seasoned professional Drum Kit and Percussion teacher. Both are established professionals in their musical fields and it was a privilege to get their feedback about the various ensembles. The Orchestra, Marimba Bands, Big Band, Rock Bands, Concert Band, Siyakhanya Choir, and Chamber Choir performed for them. The many hours of practice came in handy as the Concert Band. Siyakhanya Choir, Chamber Choir, Rock Bands, and Marimba Band were all awarded gold diplomas that shone as brightly as the extraordinary talent they recognised. All in all, Westerford musicians received 47 gold diplomas and 61 diplomas, a very impressive display for our first-ever Westerford Eisteddfod!

### **ART**

The art eisteddfod consisted of four categories: Portrait, Landscape, Photography and "other", where pupils could really use their imagination. 50 Westerfordians entered for the Art eisteddfod, and eagerly started working on their projects over the June holidays. On Monday the 31st of July, the esteemed Kelly Johnson visited Westerford to adjudicate all the wonderful artworks handed in. Kelly Johnson graduated in 2015 from the Michaelis School of Fine Art, University of Cape Town. Of all the entries, the following pupils were awarded Gold Diplomas for their artworks: Arran Wade, Cara Nesbitt, Ingrid Heyns, Oscar Buffler and Micah Khan. We are looking forward to having many more entries in 2024, after the success of this year's Art Eisteddfod.

### **DRAMA**

The Drama section of our Cultural Eisteddfod was well-supported by our young actors, with thirty-one participants from across the grades presenting thirty-five monologues. In the main category, Existing Monologues, we had a good mix of classic pieces (think Macbeth and Antigone), South African classics (Fugard and Woza Albert) and some contemporary gems (Whiplash and Fleabag). Seven candidates received Gold Diplomas (95% and above).

In the category of Original Monologues, it was great to see ten of our pupils writing and performing their own pieces, which is no easy feat. Four were awarded Gold Diplomas in this category.

The Drama categories were adjudicated by Ms Debi Hawkins, a Cape Town theatre practitioner with plenty of experience in this area, assisted by former Westerfordian Devin Reed. The event, which was our first Drama Eisteddfod, took place in the quiet surrounds of the Drama Lab and proved to be a worthy follow up to the 2022 Monologue Competition.

On Wednesday, 23 August, GSI hosted its quarterly thrift market in the Noel Taylor Hall. This event happened for the first time in Term 2 this year and has shown much success both times it has been held.

The market gives Westerfordians an opportunity to sell second-hand clothing and accessories, as well as any hand-made items, such as candles, jewellery, and many other things. The best part about this market is that the pupils get to keep their profit, but GSI still raises money through selling their own items or

donated ones!

There were a variety of products at this term's market, including novelty t-shirts, hand-made jewellery, gemstone products, scented candles, books and other amazing unique clothing items, handmade or bought. All vendors were grateful to GSI for the opportunity to sell their items and I'm sure the Westerford community was happy to buy some new clothes!

On 23 August, ARA held our first ever, potentially annual Film festival and it was a huge success. ### **BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS**



### I write what I like - Steve Biko

This book is a collection of writings by Steve Biko from 1969-1972. It outlines many of his ideas including many of the philosophies upon which he helped found the black consciousness movement. It is a must-read for anyone trying to get a deeper understanding of South African History and the rationale behind the people who fought to end Apartheid.



### Are you with us? - Mxolisi Mgxashe

Mxolisi "Bra Ace" Mgxashe, a member of the Pan African Congress in the 60s, details the Langa killings and the effect they had on him. He also gives an insight into the PAC and what it was like to be a youth in South Africa during this turbulent time.



### My Own Liberator - Dikgang Mosenke

At only 15 years old, Dikgang Mosenke was arrested and sentenced to ten years imprisonment on Robben Island for his actions as an activist and member of the PAC. After being released, he completed a degree in law, and eventually worked to help create and protect a constitution for the new South Africa. In this book he documents the importance of family, and the value of education and hard work and how these things have helped in his journey.
