The competition is written in two categories, pairs and individuals. Westerford was well represented, with six pupils getting Gold Awards for being placed in the top 10 in their category by Grade. They were:

Yannan Ke and Olivia Dunbar (2nd in the Grade 9 pairs)

Jan Karsten (8th in the Grade 9 individuals)

Ben Maree and **Eli Williams** (who tied for 1st place in the Grade 9 individuals - both achieving 100%) **Simon Oosthuizen** (1st in Grade 11 individuals)

Gold award winners were also invited to take part in a second round of the competition, the UCT Mathematics Olympiad.

Ben Maree was awarded the UCT Mathematics Olympiad - Junior trophy for the best performance at the Olympiad by a grade 8 or 9 pupil.

The top three schools are placed from the cummulative scores of their entrants. This year Westerford was placed second after Bishops with only a half a percent difference in their scores.

UCT Maths Olympiad:

South African Teams Competition: The above resulted in Kyle making the 3rd Western Province team for SAMTC, which ranked 13th, Yannan making the second team which ranked 3rd, and Ben and Eli making the first team, which was ranked first overall in the junior section.

In the senior section, **Caroline Cress** was chosen for the first Western Province team which was ranked first, **Simon Oosthuizen** for the second team which was ranked 4th, and **William Alexander** for the third team which was ranked 5th overall.

Congratulations to all of the participants for these very impressive results - we are extremely proud of you!



On Friday night, 15 September, the Jewish community celebrated the birthday of the universe and the beginning of the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, which also marks the start of the High Holidays, the Yamim Nora'im. Then came the 10 Days of Repentance, which ended with Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, in which Jewish people all over the world fasted for 25 hours.

Rosh Hashanah is celebrated through acts such as blowing the Shofar, a ram's horn, and, my favourite, consuming sweet foods, such as apples dipped in honey, and pomegranates. Along with challah which contains raisins (and sometimes chocolate) and is baked into a round loaf during this period, it symbolises a sweet new year.

Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the Jewish year, took place from Sunday night to Monday night, from the 9th to the 10th of Tishrei. Many members of our Jewish community fasted from sunset to sunset, abstaining from food and drink and devoting the period entirely to G-d.

STEVE BIKO AND THE BLACK CONSCIOUSNESS MOVEMENT BY DELILAH STOLOFF

On 12 September, many South Africans commemorated the death of Steve Biko, an anti-Apartheid activist and founder of the Black Consciousness Movement, who was killed in police custody in 1977 at just 31 years old. The anniversary of his death is now devoted to honouring his life and his contributions to the fight against Apartheid.

In 1969, during his time studying medicine at the University of Natal, he founded the Black Consciousness Movement (BCM), driven by his experiences in a racially segregated and oppressive society. The BCM aimed to empower black South Africans by instilling pride in their identity and heritage, aiming to inspire anti-Apartheid activism through the introduction of ideas of black pride, self-esteem, self-reliance, and black empowerment, and believed that liberating the minds of the oppressed was the key to liberating Black South Africans. His most recognisable quotation is as follows: "The most potent weapon in the hands of the oppressor is the mind of the oppressed."

In the aftermath of the anniversary of his death, colloquially known as Steve Biko Day, we encourage you to read up on his story in order to gain a deeper understanding of his life, Apartheid, and the ongoing struggle against racial inequality in South Africa. His commitment to justice and equality inspired so many, and continues to do so to this day. As we commemorate his death, remember to celebrate his life, his work, his legacy, and the progress he made in helping to build a better world.

Congratulations to all our wonderful music pupils, their teachers, and accompanists.




